<p><b>Background</b></p>	<p>In January 2010, the China- ASEAN FTA came into full effect creating the world's largest FTA with a population of 1.9 billion people. China has also announced the establishment of a USD10 bill Fund to promote and develop infrastructure projects in Southeast Asia. The China-ASEAN FTA has led to a major increase in trade and investment flows between China and ASEAN. How can China and ASEAN work closer together? How to attract more Chinese investments into the ASEAN countries?</p>
