In 15 years, a handful of supporters, mostly adoptive parents of Chinese babies, have grown to include 30,000 supporters world-wide, as well as a growing number of caring corporate citizens and private foundations.



## **Buddhist Compassion Relief TzuChi Foundation**

In 1966, Dharma Master Cheng Yen established the Tzu Chi Foundation in Hualien. With the spirit of selfdiscipline, diligence, frugality, and perseverance, Tzu Chi sets out to help the poor and relieve suffering. Over time, its mission extended beyond Charity into Medicine, Education, Renwen (Culture), Bone Marrow Donation, Environmental Protection, Community Volunteerism, and International Disaster Relief. As Tzu Chi carries out charitable services all across China, the Tzu Chi Foundation in China was established and recognized in 2008 and received a rating of 4A in 2012. Tzu Chi originated in the remote Hualien area and expanded to all five major continents of the world with chapters and offices in nearly 50 countries. Tzu Chi provides aid to over 80 nations. Its volunteers selflessly contribute through a mindset of gratitude, expressing their sincerest care and support to each and every individual in need.



## **Macau Foundation**

The objective of the Macao Foundation is to promote, develop and research on the cultural, social, economic, educational, scientific, academic and philanthropic activities of Macao, as well as all kinds of activities that aim to promote Macao. ## **Holt International Foundation of China**

Holt International Foundation of China (HIFC) is a non-profit NGO based in the United States. In 2010, HIFC completed the registration of its Representative Office in Beijing, with all funding originating from the USA. Its predecessor is Holt international Children's Services, which was established by Mr. and Mrs. Holt in Eugene, Oregon, USA. Holt International is one of the most reputable international organizations in the US providing services to children. The relationship between Holt International and HIFC is mutual partnership. The mission of HIFC is to provide services to orphaned and vulnerable children in China, so they can grow up like other children in China---in a loving and caring environment. Holt manages more than 20 projects and 2 offices in 9 provinces throughout China, which provides foster care, group home, social adaptation, family strengthening, and nutrition services to children. Holt also works with orphanages and the Chinese Center for Children's Welfare and Adoption (CCCWA) to provide international adoption services for children from all over China. To date, 5000 orphaned children have found homes in the US through our services.





## The Hong Kong Jockey Club

Established in 1884 as a private institution, The Hong Kong Jockey Club is one of the largest horse racing organizations in the world. It is the only authorized horse racing and regulated football betting operator in Hong Kong, running also the Mark Six lottery scheme. The Club contributes on average HK\$16.3 billion a year to the Hong Kong economy, equivalent to 1.3% of Hong Kong's GDP. The Club employs over 26,000 full- and part-time staff, making it one of the ten largest non-government employers in Hong Kong. More importantly, The Club is the largest non-government donor in Hong Kong and one of the largest donors in the world. Over the past decades, the Club's donation of more than 13 billion provided much needed support to all sectors of society, averaging over HK\$ 1 billion a year with a record of HK\$1.95 billion in 20012/13. The Club operates under a not-forprofit business model. It has no shareholders, no dividend payments, with all of its surplus dedicated to charitable cause and community projects. The Club has been upholding the donation principle of giving back to Hong Kong with that it has benefited from its operations. However, the Club has been increasingly addressing the needs of Mainland compatriots by supporting over the years with donations and program sponsorship. The Club contributed HK\$1.2 billion to the Beijing 2008 Olympic Equestrian events and the Guangzhou 2010 Asian Games Equestrian Vents by building world-class equestrian facilities, assisting the organizers with a wider range of supporting and professional services. Moreover, the Club has also helped victims of natural disasters in Mainland with swift donations in excess of HK\$1.2 billion over the past decade.





## **The Chen Yet-Sen Family Foundation**

Established in 2003, The Chen Yet-Sen Family Foundation is a hybrid charitable institution with a strategic focus on improving early childhood literacy, through the development of libraries and reading programs. The Foundation also supports experiential out-of-classroom programs which aim to improve personal development of children. As a hybrid organization, the Foundation supports grants programs as well as operates our own Special Projects. Grants are awarded to organizations whose projects promise sustainable social impact, and are innovative and cost effective. ## International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies Regional Delegation

IFRC is the world's largest volunteerbased humanitarian network, reaching 150 million people each year through our 187 member National Societies. Together, we act before, during and after disasters and health emergencies to meet the needs and improve the lives of vulnerable people. At the IFRC, we work as partners in development, responding to disasters, supporting healthy and safe living, and improving humanitarian standards. Using the collective experience of our network, we also strengthen the capacities and leadership of our member National Societies. The result: we help reduce vulnerabilities, make communities more resilient and foster a culture of peace around the world. The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement has three main components: the International Committee of the Red Cross, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies and its 187 member National Societies. The Movement is neutral and impartial, and provides protection and assistance to people affected by disasters and conflicts.



## Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA)

JICA upholds the vision of "inclusive and dynamic development" that encourages all people to participate in addressing development issues and enjoy the fruits of such endeavors. As the "one-stop shop of Japan's ODA," JICA supports developing countries to address the development challenges through technical cooperation, loan aid and grant aid. JICA, one of the largest bilateral aid agencies, has some 100 overseas offices and extends its operation in more than 150 countries and regions. JICA China office was established in 1982.





## Asia-Pacific Network for Sustainable Forest Management & Rehabilitation

The APFNet was proposed by China at the 15th Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Economic Leaders' Meeting in 2007, co-sponsored by the United States and Australia, and the decision to do so was incorporated in the Sydney Declaration. In 2008, APFNet was launched and its Secretariat located in Beijing. As a regional international organization, APFNet is open to and welcomes participation from all economies in the Asia-Pacific region, civil society organizations, the private sector, forestry academic institutions and international/regional organizations. Currently, APFNet has 31 members across the region. The mission of APFNet is to help promote and improve sustainable forest management and rehabilitation. APFNet adopts four pillars, capacity building, information sharing, supporting regional policy dialogues and demonstration projects to organize its programs and activities. By supporting demonstration projects, APFNet is dedicated to developing, demonstrating and promoting sound models, practices and policies of sustainable forest management and rehabilitation. By 2012, eleven projects have been funded with an amount of USD 7 million, benefiting 20 economies. Aware of the impacts of the cooperation mechanisms such as APEC, Association of Southeast Asia Nations (ASEAN), Greater-Mekong Sub region (GMS) and Asia Europe Meeting (ASEM), APFNet endeavors to engage in and leverage those high-level platforms to further facilitate dialogues and mutual learning in policy making and enforcement among forestry.



## **Mercy Corps**

Mercy Corps is a 33-year-old humanitarian organization that saves and improves lives in the world's toughest places. Mercy Corps programs help people turn the crises of natural disasters, conflict, and poverty into opportunities—by providing them with the tools and support they need to transform their own lives. Since 1979, Mercy Corps has provided \$2.5 billion in assistance to people in 114 nations. 88% of the resources donated to Mercy Corps over the past five years have gone directly to the programs that help people in need. Mercy Corps works in the toughest places in the world. In these places, a child's life is often at risk. A woman' s education is often ignored. A family's livelihood is never a sure thing. These conditions threaten the welfare of neighborhoods, towns, provinces, countries, and entire regions. Mercy Corps believes every crisis contains the seeds of opportunity. Even as we respond to urgent shortterm needs, we help people seize opportunities to build back better. We keep working after the TV cameras have gone to bring about a recovery that people can sustain on their own. Believing that people are the best agents of their own change, Mercy Corps works closely with the communities we serve and 95% of our field staff are local people.



## Fauna & Flora International (FFI)

Founded in 1903, FFI is the world's longestestablished international conservation organization. It is a proven conservation innovator which continues to make a lasting impact on global biodiversity. Today FFI is active in over 40 countries and has its headquarters in Cambridge, UK. FFI has been active in China since 1999 with a focus on building capacity for biodiversity conservation and sustainable development, and registered in 2008. FFI China presently has 3 offices in Nanning, Chengdu, Beijing, as well as the Haikou Liaison Office. Nowadays, FFI China Programme actives in high-level biodiversity area in China, such as Guangxi, Yunnan, Hainan, Sichuan, Qinghai, Guizhou, Chongqing, which are also in need of conservation.





### **HSBC**

HSBC Group is one of the world's largest financial service institutions. HSBC Bank (China) Company Limited officially opened business in April 2007 and is a leading international bank in Mainland China. HSBC has a long commitment to Mainland community. The earliest donation was recorded in 1878 when the Bank donated 1000 Yin Yuan to support disaster-hit people in China. Since 1991, HSBC started to consistently donate to China in support of community development. By early 2013, the accumulated donation has exceeded RMB600 million. The projects range from education, environment protection and community welfare and reach to 31 provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities. Millions of people have directly benefited. HSBC has been managing its donations and philanthropic projects in a professional and transparent way, in order to maximize project impact and in a sustainable way. Since the establishment of "China Charity Award" by Ministry of Civil Affairs in 2005, HSBC is the only foreign company to have won the "Most Charitable Company" award for 8 consecutive times. In addition to financial support, HSBC staff also actively engaged in community development through providing volunteering services.



## **University of Hong Kong**

The Faculty of Social Sciences was established in 1967 and comprises five departments and seven multi-disciplinary research centres. Through over 45 years of development and growth, the Faculty has become one of the leading schools in social and political science education and research globally. The Faculty has identified two arching themes to guide its development: social innovation and global citizenship. In the concept of social innovation, it seeks to fuse social responsibility and social leadership; as for global citizenship, to embrace global awareness and global engagement. The Faculty offers a wide range of programmes at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The current Undergraduate student population is about 1500. The Faculty strongly encourages students for off-campus learning: international exchange studies; local and overseas internships and summer institute in China and Taiwan. At the taught postgraduate level, the Faculty at present offers twelve coursework programmes leading to doctoral and master's degrees. These programmes are providing continuous education and training to about 1000 professional practitioners and managerial personnel. In addition, there are over 200 research postgraduate students in the Faculty pursuing degrees of Master of Philosophy or Doctor of Philosophy in a wide range of research strengths of the Faculty: such as China Studies; NGO and Civil Society; Public Policy Studies; as well as Social and Cognitive Neuroscience. The Faculty takes great pride in its academic and professional excellence, diversity of its faculty and students, and contribution to the wellbeing of the community and international networking.





## **Sowers Action**

Established in 1992, Sowers Action is a non-religious, non-political and non-profit-making charitable organization in Hong Kong, committed to promote education aid in rural China by helping poor or disabled students to complete their education, reconstructing schools and facilities that fulfill safety regulations and improving the quality of teacher training. Emphasizing "On-site Assessment, Direct Subsidy and Long Term Follow-up", we raise funds for education aid and operational expenditure separately to ensure donations are used effectively. Major fundraising events, including "Challenging 12 Hours Charity Marathon", "Walk to Guangzhou", "Long March for Education", "Ancient Tea Horse Route Expedition" and "Cycling for Education", are held annually to raise public awareness. In response to the nation's changing needs, we have adopted an approach of "multipurpose educational aid", extending our focus from hardware facilities to four major areas: special education, teacher training, student sponsorship, and school construction and facilities, with the aim of fully utilizing our donations and resources. As of June 2013, Sowers Action has funded over 1,250 school construction projects, subsidized over 289,000 student-years, 450 university students and 24,000 teachers for teacher training programs. Altogether, we have risen over RMB390 million for education in Mainland China.







## **Centre for Third Sector Studies, Hong Kong Polytechnic University**

The Centre for Third Sector Studies (CTSS) strives to work for Third-Sector related studies of theoretical and applied concerns in the greater China and overseas. Enthusiasts of the Department of Applied Social Sciences (APSS) who are experienced in the Third-Sector related studies came together to set up the Centre in 2004. Since its establishment, CTSS aims to serve as a platform for cross-sector (i.e. government-market-Third Sectors) and crosscultural collaborations on Third Sector-related projects. Up to now, affiliates of CTSS have worked relatively more frequently with NGOs in academics (e.g. scholars and research units in local universities) and social service sectors (e.g. Hong Kong SKH Lady MacLehose Centre), as well as governmental organizations (e.g. the Central Policy Unit, the Social Welfare Department); to look at the operation of local Third Sector and the collaborating synergy amongst three sectors. The focus of the recent research projects can be classified into four clusters: 1) Third Sector and Civil Society; 2) Social Enterprises and Tripartite Partnership; 3) Knowledge Management and Capacity Building; 4) Social Work Professionalization.





## **Hong Kong Disneyland**

Hong Kong Disneyland Resort offers immersive, unique Disney experiences for all families, generations and ages to enjoy. Hong Kong is one of only five locations in the world that is home to a Disney themed park and the many Disney characters that are beloved the world over, such as Mickey, Minnie, Donald, Stitch and Buzz Lightyear. Since the Grand Opening in September 2005, Hong Kong Disneyland has received more than 38 million Guests from around the globe. Kids4Kids is a HK based non-profit organization and registered charitable institution (91/10742) exempt from tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance. Our mission is to help children take responsibility to care for others and for the world we live in. This marked the launch of Kids4Kids Books, where kids use their creative writing and illustration talents to publish books, sell them and donate the proceeds to local charities.

We inspire and empower kids to make a difference in creative and dynamic ways, through our programs (Kids4Kids Creations, Kids4Kids Advocates, Kid4Kids In Action), kids are able to organize activities or even create products to provide support to the local community. They are also able to support local charities that we work with, those who serve the community in the areas of Education. Environment and Health.





## **Autism Hong Kong**

We are a self-help group consists of parents and volunteers first established in year 2000. ## **Project Vision (PV)**

Project Vision was initiated by Hong Kong Specialist in Ophthalmology Prof. Dennis S. C. Lam in 2004 with the aim to save the sight of visually impaired and provide sustainable quality eye care services in rural China. "Give a man a fish, and he will eat for a day. Teach a man to fish, and he will eat for a lifetime." We offer cataract surgical training to local doctors and establish permanent medical teams in the deprived areas to ensure sustainable quality eye care service is accessible. Through equipment donation, skill transfer and modern management, they eye centers are able to self-run sustainable with one-off donation. We offer quality surgeries at cost with the aim to help the centers operate in a self-sufficient model and offer free surgeries to underprivileged patients. With the full support from all sectors of the society, so far, a total of 26 charity eye centers (an eye hospital included) have been set up in 8 provinces in Mainland with more than 100 eye doctors trained to perform cataract surgeries and near 100,000 cataract surgeries performed. Let join hands to light up the eyes of the needy in China!



### **Badi Foundation**

The Badi Foundation was founded in Macau in 1990, where it is registered as a non-profit charitable organization. The Foundation established a representative office in Beijing in 1997 which is dedicated to releasing the potential of individuals and institutions in China to advance their own communities. We work with individuals in rural and semi-rural areas who have a strong desire to serve their communities, and assist them to initiate a process of action and reflection focused on advancing the development of their community in collaboration with local government. Through training, accompaniment and the provision of seed funding the foundation assists these individuals to establish their own non-profit organization dedicated to realizing the aspirations of the local population to contribute to the balanced development of their community. At the present time, the Badi Foundation has established and is accompanying 27 communitybased organizations and program groups in 12 provinces of mainland China. The Foundation also operates the School of the Nations, an internationally-oriented school in Macau S.A.R. that seeks to foster the intellectual and moral development of its students in an integrated manner, while developing their commitment to service to the broader community.


Yang Tuan
